Sébastien Caporusso (BE)

Designer

Passionate about the decorative arts. Sébastien Caporusso is a Belgian designer with Italian roots. With his furniture and lighting, mixing noble materials, organic shapes and unusual lines, Caporusso excels in producing objects of otherworldly beauty. He favours local materials: stone, brass, marble and other mineral materials sourced from the best Belgian craftsmen. Penetrating into the imagination of this interior architect and designer is not a linear journey, but a dreamlike interpretation of the materials. His talent lies in combining beautiful materials that create an unexpected scenography, an eclectic mix of objects and colours from his own universe. The symbolic forms of his work are characterised by organic outlines as well as majestic and unique cuts. Sébastien has a preference for rare, irregular and unique objects. "I use noble materials in my work, but never too ostentatious, that fit into the spaces I am redesigning or when I am embellishing the furniture I have designed. The wear of the walls of a Venetian palazzo inspires me, as does a sheet of oxidized bronze. I like materials with a history,

a past, that have lived, like the cobblestoned sidewalks of Rio or the Engawa planks in Kyoto. At every moment, it is about natural materials, soft colours and minerals, which give life to my projects." states Caporusso. With his furniture and lighting, mixing noble materials, organic shapes and unusual lines, Caporusso excels in producing such pieces of furniture of otherworldly beauty for the gallery. Spazio Nobile represents him since 2018.

Pierre Charrié (FR) Designer

Graduated from the Beaux-Arts and École Nationale Supérieure de Création Industrielle (ENSCI-Les Ateliers), Pierre Charrié is fascinated by the sensory dimension of everyday objects, and explores how materials, sounds or gestures can trigger new interactions and transcend the ordinary. Passionate about music, his research and experimentation into the sound quality of objects have earned him recognition from his peers, with some of his works featured in the permanent collection of the Centre national des arts plastiques (CNAP). A versatile designer, he works with a wide range of natural materials, including wood and ceramics, as well as feathers and mother-of-pearl, which he combines with innovative yet ancestral techniques used by the craftsmen he meets. With the Surfaces Sonores project, he won the Agora grant in 2013. Since then, he has continued his work on the sound qualities of objects, notably with Galerie MICA. Pierre Charrié won the Grand Prix de la Création de la Ville de Paris in 2015, was named Rising Talent at Maison&Objet 2016, Young Designer

of the Year by Elle Décoration France in 2017, he won the Kaldewei Future Award by A&W magazine in 2019, was named one of AD magazine's Top 100 Designers of 2019 and 2020, and won the Prix de la Monnaie de Paris in 2022. His work is edited by Ligne Roset, Habitat, Moustache, Petite Friture, Radar Interior, galerie MICA, Great Design Gallery and CushCush Gallery. Spazio Nobile represents Pierre Charrié since 2024.

Brushed collection is the result of a workshop with Hanoia, a Vietnamese company specializing in lacquer objects. It is an experiment in how lacquer can be used, both in the effects and colors chosen and in the types of object to which it is applied. Moving away from traditional lacquer boxes and trays, these functional objects hang on walls like works of art. Their curved, edge-free volumes highlight the beauty of the colored material, while the gradient effect perfected by Hanoia's workshops demonstrates the delicacy of the lacquerers' know-how. Florence Coenraets (BE)
Feather Artist

Florence Coenraets initiates intimate dialogues with our material world and interrogates our relationship to objects and by extension, to our environment. She's been exploring and working with feathers for many years, a natural medium that fascinates her greatly. Born in Eupen, Belgium, she studied at Institut d'Architecture Victor Horta, worked in various architect offices then obtained her master's degree at Sint Lukas, School of Arts, where she developed a hybrid head pieces project. She then deepened her competences in millinery where she met feathers for the first time, a medium she's embraced ever since. She followed a featherwork course at the Académie des métiers d'art in Paris which led her to develop various artistic projects based on the physical and emotional particularities of feathers. Her work has been featured internationally, she was part of the exhibition a World of Feathers at the Volkenkunde Museum in Leiden and the Etnografiska Museet in Stockholm. Her headpieces were presented in various shows in Brussels such as Nationa(a)l expo store, Design September, Belgium is fashion,

as well as at Designsupermarket in Prague. In 2015, Florence Coenraets received the Weekend Fashion Award in the accessories category for her "coherent, fresh and singular" work. Her headpieces were presented during the défilé Cohort at WIELS. Her participatory project mixing millinery and photography was shown at the Maison des Cultures de Saint Gilles and in the Musée Royal d'Afrique centrale in Tervuren. Raw materials and the energy that emanates from them are the point of departure of her artistic explorations. By mixing in ancestral techniques into her practice Coenraets interweaves the sacred and the contemporary into singular pieces. Florence Coenraets is represented by Spazio Nobile since 2022. The artist will have her first solo show at the gallery end of 2024.





Marie Corbin (FR) Architecte, Scenographer

Ker-Xavier is a collective of French artists and architects. Marie Corbin, the group's representative, holds an ADE and HMONP diploma in architecture from ENSA Paris-Belleville. In 2006, she began her training as a scenographer in the museum design department of the Centre Georges Pompidou in Paris. From 2008, she enriched her museographic experience in the world of contemporary art by offering her production support services to the artists Anu Pennanen and Benoît Maire, before creating her own scenographies for the BPI of the Centre Pompidou, the IMEC or on the occasion of several public contract competitions for the MAM of the city of Paris and the Grand Palais. Between 2013 and 2016, she collaborated with set designers Maciei Fiszer and Laurence Fontaine for the Fondation Louis Vuitton, the LAM, the Quai Branly, the MuCEM, the Cinémathèque, the Louvre Lens... Ker-Xavier is a French design label run by architect Marie Corbin (b.1983) and artist Benoît Maire (b.1978). The label was created in Paris by 5 architects in 2011 and

established itself as a company called Ker-Xavier Sarl in 2018 in Bordeaux. Between 2011 and 2015. Ker-Xavier was mainly involved in exhibition design. In 2014, Marie Corbin worked with the French-Vietnamese artist Thu Van Tran on the Marguerite Duras exhibition for the Centre Pompidou in Paris, setting up a partnership and production follow-up in order to produce the artist's installation. In 2016, Benoît Maire was asked to design the scenography of photographer Julien Carreyn's work at the Crèvecoeur gallery in Paris for the exhibition "Photographies du soir". This was the starting point for the creation of a line of furniture called "du soir". Ker-Xavier produces objects and furniture such as tables, chairs, stools, lamps and vases, based on an experimental workshop method; and is still involved in exhibition scenography with notably Foncteur d'oubli x at the Plateau Fonds Régional d'Art Contemporain in Paris at the end of 2019. Spazio Nobile represents Marie Corbin since 2020.

Stone, as a foundation, carries a symbolism that spans the ages and is linked to a specific site and a narrative that reflects Marie Corbin's practice. The *Vase Pierre* was designed in collaboration with the CRAFT in Limoges. The original stone comes from a river in the Pyrenees. The stone was moulded and then returned to its original river to continue its evolution as a stone. So this is a frozen moment in its life, and the imprint leaves us with a record of how it will look in 2023.

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Mae Engelgeer (NL) Designer

Textile design has always been at the heart of Dutch designer Mae Engelgeer's work, from her high schooldays to her studies at the Amsterdam Fashion Institute and Sandberg Instituut. Since opening her own studioin 2013, she has nurtured her curiosity for the craft, experimenting within the existing boundaries of textileproduction to elevate old techniques to a modern stage. Mae Engelgeer's work embraces subtle colour palettes, patterns and linear elements. Complex compositions merge with perfection to establish harmony. Creative explorations into the contrasting of materials and textures result in works that luxurious in their tactility and dimensionality. In addition to developing her own collections, Mae Engelgeer collaborates with brands around the world on projects ranging from textile products and furniture design to material explorations and art direction to large-scale installations and public artworks. Currently, The "Ori-An", showcasing a textile tea room at Hosoo Gallery in Kyoto which is on display at LVMH Métiers d'Art in Paris inside the Ambient Weaving

exhibition, is designed with "Shoji Fabrics" created by Dutch textile designer Mae Engelgeer. These textiles were produced using a Nishijin textile's traditional weaving method called "sha", a technique in which two warp yarns are twined when weaving in a weft varn to create an openwork weave on the front side of the textile. "Ori-An" is distinct in many ways from what we know today as a Japanese tea room or teahouse. The tea room is designed with the cooperation of Reijiro Izumi, the president of Sabié, an organization that explores contemporary expressions of the tea ceremony culture. According to Izumi, one of the roots of a tea room is the idea of creating a place for gathering by enclosing the space. Such spatial composition is consistent with the unique features of Japanese architecture, which historically has defined spaces with partitions like fusuma and shoji screens. Spazio Nobile represents Mae Engelgeer since 2024.

Éva Garcia (FR)

Éva Garcia was born in 1980 in the Dordogne; she lives and works in Paris. In 2010 she joined the engraving workshop of Paris Atelier, under the direction of Mireille Baltar. In 2013 she was awarded the Graver Maintenant prize. In 2014 she joined the Bo Halbirk workshop. 2019 marks a turning point in her artistic career with her first solo show at the Schumm-Braustein gallery in Paris. In 2020, the Académie des Beaux-Arts awarded her the Prix Frédéric et Jean de Vernon, in printmaking. Éva Garcia's practice is mainly centred on engraving, of which she uses all the techniques, including sugar, burin, point, and cradle, gradually favouring direct engraving. She offers us visions that are both ethereal and tangible, impressions of an experimental nature. What interests her is the image, which in its very essence is multiple, evolving from its inscription to its inevitable dispersion. Although she begins her work by incising a matrix, the artist plays with the principle of the print and its identical multiplication, by intervening on the print itself or by working on the printing supports. It is not a question of variations in series but of repeated, transposed, multiple writings, operating a transfer of language. Through these games, these experiments, these interpenetrations of gestures, techniques and materials, through the formats which impose a physical investment of the whole body, the confrontation with the material is at the same time rough, harsh but also subtle. It is not surprising that the artist now opens her practice to painting and sculpture, always remaining at the crossroads of engraving, in a relationship of circularity. Spazio Nobile presented Éva Garcia's first Solo Show "Cette lumière peut-elle" in 2022. The gallery will present her upcoming Solo Show in Spring 2025, following her one-year residency at Fondation Fiminco, France. Spazio Nobile represents her since 2022.

Garnier & Linker (FR) Artists Designers

Guillaume Garnier and Florent Linker are two French creators based in Paris. They aim at giving a contemporary design to rare materials and savoirfaire. All pieces are handmade unique or limited editions by French master craftsmen. As designers, they get their inspiration from decorative arts and sculpture, to create pure-shaped forms revealing their materiality. With their background in interior design, they conceive functional objects that meet contemporary interiors of enlightened collectors who seek art and design collectibles with a soul. They have created two singular collections for Spazio Nobile in Brussels, one is the Parisis lamps in plaster and alabaster and, another one is the molten glass Diatomée Sculpted Vases which appear like diatoms that are single-celled algae that live in houses made of glass. Inspired by these light-absorbing molecules which are the only organism on the planet with cell walls composed of transparent, opaline silica, they are ornamented by intricate and striking patterns of silica. On earth, diatoms are bringing us up to 50% of our oxygen and also feed the oceans, lakes and rivers. Garnier & Linker have experimented this fascinating lostwax casting technique mastered by French glass maker Olivier Fonderflick. Since 2020, Spazio Nobile has initiated artistic collaborations and projects with floral artists around *Diatomée* such as Ikebana master Jozef Prelis Seihō and Parisbased creator Arturo Arita, respectively on the exhibitions *Ikebana* at Collectible and *Call to the Wild* at Maison Louis Carré (arch Alvar Aalto) in Summer 2020 and for *Spazio Nobile at Home*: *Living Ikebanas*. Garnier & Linker are represented by Spazio Nobile since 2019.



Kaspar Hamacher (BE) Sculptor, Artist & Designer

With a degree from the Academie Beeldende Kunsten in Maastricht, the Netherlands, Kaspar Hamacher, originally from Belgium's Eastern Cantons, takes nature as the starting point in his daily life as a sculptor and a designer of artistic furniture. Monoxyle purity blooms from sylvan beauty. Raised in woodlands by his forest ranger father, he has forged a unique and very personal path through the world of art and design, winding his way between sculpture and the contemporary applied arts. Far from the rush of our digital world, Kaspar Hamacher creates a close and unique connection with each fragment of trunk he sculpts, crafting unique stamped pieces out of his own creative energy. He resolutely focuses on the object in all its physical strength, more as a "maker" than a conceptual designer. His abilities with wood, as a living material, are the fruit of his energy and his imagination: whether working with a tree stump or a piece of leather, for him it is essential to respect authenticity at every step of the creative process. In his design approach, which he has called Die Werkstatt (The exhibition at Spazio Nobile, Hamacher always aims to create a piece that is both unique and personal, with a strong meaning and added soul. "Le Sacre de la Matière" reflects his authenticity, while *Mother Earth* is at the heart of his identity, the eponymous title of his solo exhibition at CID Hornu which ran from June to September 2021. Spazio Nobile represents Kaspar Hamacher since 2016.

Pao Hui Kao (TW) Artist, Designer

Artist, Designer, Pao Hui Kao studied Industrial Design at Huafan University in Taipei, Taiwan. After gaining four years of experience as an industrial designer, she pur-sued a Master's program at the Design Academy Eindhoven, from which she obtained her Master of Arts degree in 2016. Her work reflects signi ficant influences from innovative materials. traditional craftsmanship, social issues, and ecological concerns. Through the creation of objects, sculptures, and installations, her work emphasizes the transformation of ordinary materials and surroundings into extraordinary aesthetics. Pao Hui Kao's projects merge the forces of nature with human artifacts. Her studio serves as a platform for ongoing research in experimental design, imbuing man-made sculptural forms and installations with deeper meaning through their interaction with nature and its elements. This process of develop-ment enables Pao Hui Kao to weave a narrative where the natural and the artificial converge to shape landscapes for the mind to explore the philosophical quandaries that confront the human condition. In 2020, Pao Hui Kao created two collections for Spazio Nobile: Paper Pleats and Lacquer Leaf, in which she explores the symbiosis of both organic and mineral ele-ments using tracing paper, crepe paper, rice glue, Urushi lacquer, color pigments, and kintsugi. Pao Hui Kao was also a finalist for the LOEWE FOUNDATION Craft Prize in 2022 and had her solo exhibition 25 Seasons, Landscapes of Paper and Lacquer, at the gallery in 2023 and a Duo Show LuniSolar with Ann Beate Tempelhaug at Design Miami/Basel in 2024. Her creations have entered private and institutional collections, including the POC Foundation, Boghossian Foundation, among others. Pao Hui Kao is represented by Spazio Nobile since 2019.

Herfirst solo exhibition "25 Seasons" was presented in autumn 2023 at the gallery. *Paper Pleats Original & Urushi* and *Urushi Lacquer Leaf*, are two collections from this long phase of experimentation to which rice glue and Urushi lacquer have been added. Her artistic processes are both rudimentary and sophisticated and date back centuries. A finalist for the LOEWE FOUNDATION Craft Prize 2022, Pao works with materials that have been used for a very long time, innovating from what exists and pushing the boundaries towards a more contemporary object culture.

Katherine Huskie (UK) Artist, Glassblower

Katherine Huskie has been working with glass for over 10 years. Huskie started experimenting with glass at college and subsequently went to the University of Sunderland where she studied for a BA (Hons) in Glass and Ceramics. Huskie specialised in blown glass early on and since then it has become her passion. Glass blowing has taken Huskie all over the world including a year based in Australia where she worked with numerous different glass makers to expand and broaden her knowledge. The experience provided Huskie with the passion and determination to push her own glass designs. On returning to the UK she set up Devereux & Huskie Glassworks with James Devereux. They specialise in creating glass for designers and artists from the UK and overseas. Huskie has always been interested in pattern whether it is within nature, textiles or geometry. She is always searching for new influences and how she can include the patterns in hot glass. Huskie was named Wimbledon Championship Artist 2018 alongside Nancy Sutcliffe. They collaborated to create 2 large scale glass works

that are on display in the Clubhouse. In 2020 Huskie became a QEST scholar, she received a grant to allow her to continue learning the craft of Neon. Katherine Huskie is represented by Spazio Nobile Gallery since 2020. Huskie's work has a strong identity with form and pattern, whether it is technique or ascetic driven. Katherine Huskie is always searching for new influences and how she can incorporate the inspiration within hot glass. Huskie has travelled with her glass spending a year working in Australia learning new techniques and gathering experiences and ideas. Katherine Huskie is represented by Spazio Nobile since 2019.

Mouth blown and heat pinched, each sculpture is inspired by the sea urchin shells or mussel shells found on the rocks of the British coast. Their rippling texture has inspired her master glassmaking where each piece of glass is individually applied to the surface and thus dictates the final shape of each of her unique pieces with their deep, shimmering colours. Her sculptures can also become vases for stylised bouquets.


Åsa Jungnelius (SE) Artist, Sculptor, Glass Maker

Born in 1975, Åsa Jungnelius lives and works in Stockholm and Månsamåla, Sweden. Jungnelius' artistic practice involves a material exploration that moves between the monumental and the socially and psychologically constructed. Through the physicality of the object, she questions how identities and bodily desires are formed and expressed. Her interest in body and matter centres on questions of the constant renegotiation of these two entities throughout human history. Since the early 2000s, Jungnelius has exhibited in Sweden and internationally, and has initiated and run art projects: Residence-In-Nature, WeWorkInAFragileMaterial LASTSTUDIO. Her recent major public art commissions include the new Hagastaden metro station, for which she created Snäckan, a commission she has been working on since 2015 and is expected to be completed in 2027. The process-based public work in Södra Hamnen for Norrköpings Konstmuseum and The Inner World Exhibition began with the performance PAVILJONG 1# ENERGIER, where a hot air balloon trapped in the disused Bråvallaverket (plant), rose and fell like a collective solar mother in a common industrial wound. In addition, 20# Pavilions with an accompanying public program and permanent site-specific art has opened in the autumn of 2023. The Transit of Venus (2023), a two-part group of sculptures placed next to Observatorielunden, is a relational monument to 8 March, International Women's Day, donated to the City of Stockholm. Jungnelius' breakthrough was with her early works in glass and she has since held the position as one of Sweden's leading artists within the field and has been one of Kosta Boda's permanent artists since 2007 as well as running her own glass studio in Månsamåla since 2013. Her work has been shown in recent years at at Gallery Leu in Munich (solo 2023), Gallery Glas (solo 2023), Market Art Fair (solo 2022), Kunstnarens hus in Oslo (2021), Artipelag (2020), Stene Project (solo 2020), ArkDes (2018-19), Xiangning Art Museum in Shenzhen (2019), Vandalorum (solo 2019) and Luleå Biennale (2019). Åsa Jungnelius is represented by Gallery Leu, Munich and Spazio Nobile Gallery, Brussels. She became a member of Bildkonstnärsfonden (Swedish Arts Grants Committee) in 2023. In 2024-2025, a public art work was completed for a new cultural center in Gävle in conjunction with the inaugurational exhibition as well as an artistic research project in a collaboration with Consulate General, Swedish Research Institute and Pera Museum Istanbul in Turkey. She had her solo show Desire Utensil Container at Spazio Nobile in 2024. Spazio Nobile represents her since 2021.





Luis Marie (NL) Artists Designers

Paying homage to the rich textile history of their homeland, Luis Marie approach design as an experimental excercise in craftmanship and advanced technology. As textile and product designers with a love for colour and an exquisite eye for details, they challenge conventional production techniques and blur the line between art and design. Their work often breaks the mould of what is considered possible, they are refined and modern, and testify a desire for more tactility, softness and colour in our living environment. Luis Marie is a creative collaboration between Fenna van der Klei (1995) and Patricio Nusselder (1994). They met at and graduated from the prestigious Design Academy Eindhoven (2017). After working for fashion and interior designers in London and Amsterdam, they established their own design practice in Rotterdam, the Netherlands. Merging their Dutch and Spanish roots, they developed a minimalist, graphical signature with a touch of mediterranean warmheartedness. Their work has been exhibited internationally and has been awarded several resepected national as well as european development grants and acclaimed

international design prizes. More recently, in January 2024, they won the Young Talents Contest at IMM Cologne (Germany) with their latest work "Plissade". Spazio Nobile represents Luis Marie since 2023.



Isaac Monté has a fascination for unusual materials and an urge to master and manipulate these materials. He is a Belgian designer based in Rotterdam, The Netherlands. Isaac studied at art academies in Belgium, The Netherlands and Norway. His interest in product design developed at Willem de Kooning Academy in Rotterdam, where he graduated as product designer in 2013. The work of Isaac Monté has been shown in a variety of galleries and exhibitions in Belgium, The Netherlands, Italy and Germany. Isaac is lecturing and leading workshops in various institutions, from the industry (IKEA) to art academies. Monté was awarded TheThreshold Price as most talented graduate in 2013, with his project "Filter Factory". In 2014 he was awarded the Henri Winkelman Award for young creative entrepreneurs in Rotterdam. In 2015 he was announced as one of the recipients of the Bio Art and Design Awards. This award gave him the opportunity to design "The Art of Deception" in collaboration with Toby Kiers, Professor in Evolutionary Biology at the Free University in Amsterdam. Spazio Nobile represents Isaac Monté since 2019.

The *Crystallized series* is the result of research into stalagmites, one of the greatest wonders of nature. The growing process of the objects can be seen as a metaphor for time. Each object is unique in shape, colour and texture, due to the organic development of the object. The objects are the result of the natural crystallization of minerals and the influence of the designer on the formation process. This process can take up to several weeks to obtain the perfect shape, interesting colour combinations and dimensions of crystals.



Bela Silva (PT) Artist, Sculptor, Ceramist

Bela Silva was born in Lisbon, Portugal. She lives and works between Brussels, Lisbon and Paris. In Portugal she studied at the School of Fine Arts in Porto and Lisbon, and at Ar.Co. She attended Norwich Fine Arts in the United Kingdom and the Art Institute of Chicago in the United States of America. Her works have been exhibited at the Ann Nathan Gallery, the Rhona Hoffman Gallery, the Lisbon Tile Museum, the Anastácio Gonçalves Museum, the Ajuda National Palace, the Ricardo Espírito Santo Foundation, the Oriente Museum, the National Museum of Art Ancient in Lisbon and the Musée des Arts Décoratifs in Paris. She participated in exhibitions in China, Japan, Brazil, Spain and France and held several ceramic workshops in Japan and Morocco. She attended artist residencies in Kohler, Wisconsin, USA, and Fábrica Bordalo Pinheiro in Caldas da Rainha, Portugal. In 2022 her artworks were shown at Villa Tamaris, la Seyne-sur-Mer within the scope of the saison croisée France - Portugal. More recently, she has exhibited in South Korea and at the Palácio Cadaval in Portugal in 2023, and in the spring of 2024 in a solo exhibition *Caminbo Tropical* at MAC Niteroi in Brazil. Bela Silva has made several works of public art, in which she integrates her work into the architectural element. Examples are the tile panels for the Alvalade metro station, in Lisbon: the panels for the gardens of the Sakai Cultural Center in Japan and panels for the João de Deus school in the Azores. She has also produced numerous works specially designed for private collectors in Europe and the United States. Bela Silva has collaborated over the years in a variety of projects and partnerships with important international brands such as Hermès, Tiffany & Co, Serax, Viuva Lamego, Bordalo Pinheiro, Vista Alegre and Monoprix. In November 2021 she presented in Paris a hand-painted porcelain collection with the Florentine brand Ginori 1735. Bela Silva's travels are an inexhaustible source of inspiration that allow her to include local history, culture and nature in her creative approach. The artist values the connection between communities incorporating identities, traditional elements into her works that she reinterprets in a contemporary way. In 2025, Bela Silva will publish her monograph with Flammarion and have a solo museum exhibition at the Fondation Calouste Gulbenkian in Lisbon around the Sèvres collection of "Service Buffon", inspired by Buffon's 18thcentury Encyclopaedia of the natural sciences. Spazio Nobile Gallery represents Bela Silva since 2017.

Jacqueline Surdell (US) Artist, Sculptor

Iacqueline Surdell was born and raised in Chicago, IL. She received her MFA in Fibre and Material Studies from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 2017. The City's history of industrialism, labour, and Midwest grit plays a significant role in her tridimensional work. Surdell's Polish grandfather worked in the steel mills in Hegewisch while her Dutch grandmother was a landscape painter. Those close familial memories influence Surdell's complex terrain between art-making, body, sanctuary, and spirit. From childhood through college, Surdell was a competitive athlete. She approaches her studio practice with a disciplined resolve forged in the intense, repetitive, realm of competitive sports. Her years as an athlete primed her interest in repetitive, laborious, craft-based practices. Building her wall sculptures demands full body action as the body becomes a weaving shuttle and the hand a brushstroke. Although her material is fibre, her approach is painterly. She manipulates her medium with knotted layers, reducing the material to open the structure, and draping to create volume and texture. Surdell combines the meticulous precision of craft with the unbridled spontaneity of contemporary painting. She reimagines the woven canvas as a space of undulation and growth. As the expanded histories of painting materialize in her work as content, simultaneously, swollen tendrils and textures of bound rope deny illusions of the classically painted picture plane. The works actively bridge the division between painting and sculpture. In this way, her work calls into association other binary categorizations such as rigid and collapsed, construction techniques coded as masculine or feminine, and ontological spaces between body and sculpture. Her energetic and materially grounded practice brings to attention the tools, environments, and actions that contain and display performances of labour, history, and power. Jacqueline Surdell is represented by Spazio Nobile since 2020.

Ann Beate Tempelhaug (NW) Artist, Ceramist

Ann Beate Tempelhaug was born in Mosjøen, in northern Norway. Educated in the Arts and Crafts at the University of Bergen. Her work is collected by the National Museum Oslo, and the Art museums in Bergen, Trondheim and Kristiansand. Among her recent solo exhibitions are KRAFT Gallery Bergen, Bo muldsfabriken Arendal, Agder Art Center and Arteriet Gallery in Kristiansand. Among the recent group exhibitions are the Art Fairs Collective New York and Collect London. Awarded commissions at the Universities of Kristiansand and Bergen. She has received several national grants, most recently the National Art Grant for 5 years. "As the Danish artist Per Kirkeby once said: "Landscapes are always about beauty and death." By taking the landscape as inspiration, my work connects to my own life and my memories," she states. Taking things one day at a time, Norwegian ceramic artist Ann Beate Tempelhaug has been creating large scale ceramic objects for over thirty years. Her freely shaped and sculpted ceramic objects are painted completely by hand, on both their surface and borders, a testament to her curiosity and dedication to finding beauty in everyday colours and shapes. In her creative process, Tempelhaug proposes new ways of understanding how even the smallest transient moments can affect our larger context. The gallery presented her first Solo Show *«Nord»* in 2023 followed by a Duo Show, *LuniSolar*, with Pao Hui Kao at Design Miami/Basel in 2024. Fondazione Officine Saffi has invited Ann Beate Tempelhaug to present her first solo show in Italy this upcoming Spring 2025. Spazio Nobile represents Ann Beate Tempelhaug since 2020.



Kiki van Eijk grew up in the Netherlands where she spent her youth immersed in nature daydreaming and drawing. She is now one of the most accomplished names in the world of Dutch design. Her interest in product design developed at the Design Academy Eindhoven where she met her future partner, designer Joost van Bleiswijk. Her wide range of work extends from installations to furniture, from lighting to textiles, ceramics or glassware. Inspired by the smallest details of the everyday and by the forms of nature, Kiki's world is whimsical and colorful, lyrical and personal, yet refined by a rigorous attention to the process and skillful craftsmanship. Regardless of the scale of the work, the handmade and human touch remains at the heart of her practice and reinforces an intuitive and forward-thinking approach to design in the 21st century. Her collaborations include brands as Hermès, Google, Saint- Louis, Cor Unum, Bisazza, Häagen-Dazs, Serax, Bernhardt Design and Nodus. In recent years she has collaborated with companies and institutions like Coachella, Studio Edelkoort Paris, Audax Textile Museum, Zuiderzee Museum, Noord Brabants Museum, Design Academy Eindhoven, Venice Projects, Rijksmuseum, Centraal Museum Utrecht and private collectors. After her solo show *The New Harvest* in 2021 at Lempertz in Brussels, Kiki van Eijk & Joost van Bleiswijk's first Duo Show, *Serendipity* took place at the gallery in Spring 2022 followed by *A Forest of Collision and Raku* at Masterly, Milan, April 2023. 



Fabian von Spreckelsen (DE) Sculptor & Artist-Designer

A graduate of the Academie Beeldende Kunsten in Maastricht, the Netherlands, German-born artist Fabian von Spreckelsen is now based in the Netherlands. He cultivates a deep fascination for nature, passed down from his biologist father, who guided Fabian on the discovery of the delightful world of living organisms. This relationship and interaction between a constructed environment and unspoiled nature has steered his artistic instincts. Fabian von Spreckelsen is captivated by the links between humans and the natural elements surrounding them, and in his sculptural designs, he continuously interprets nature as a powerful force, requiring respect more than protection. The resulting strong and radical artwork draws inspiration from flora and fauna in their abstract geometries, with both strength and beauty in their simplest, sometimes abstract forms. The lines of his

work are clear-cut, producing visual effects that are simultaneously minimal and maximal. With his sculptural approach, he creates unique and bespoke pieces with a specific personality; the variety of his works reflects the diversity of nature and its connection with profound human values. He aims for a balance between arithmetical design, craftwork and artistic freedom, while always working with a respect for the environment and harmony with his surroundings. His recent monumental sculpture project," Freddy", in Corten steel, takes him in a new, more conceptual direction, that he also translates into his new collection of seven cabinets that combine weathered iron and tanned leather, reflecting the stages of his life in a direct extension of the artwork "The Soul Portrait" which was show at the first edition of "Le Sacre de la Matière". Spazio Nobile has represented Fabian von Spreckelsen since 2017. His Solo Exhibition Soul Memories is on display until March 1st at Spazio Nobile Studiolo.



Philipp Weber (DE) Designer

German creative Philipp Weber's holistic methodology melds his keen craft-led sensibility and affinity for humanism. Unaffected by the saturated trends that drive the design industry, the young designer delves deep into different subject matter. He approaches each topic from a comprehensive set of vantage points: the history and analysis of established manufacturing processes to the integration of seemingly disparate surprisingly appropriate associations. Graduated of Design Academy Eindhoven and University of Arts Berlin, he anchors and translates his unhurried, discursive explorations into tangible concepts and functional forms. These accessible applications push beyond the previously accepted limitations of age-old techniques and in turn, suggest ways in which to ensure their survival. It is no wonder that his chosen mediums tend to be glass, coal byproduct, cork, and textile. Though the designer frames his projects as thought-provoking referential, experimental, and expressive statement pieces, the new material properties they introduce have the most impact. As the co-founder and creative director of Analog, a commercial venture developed through Berlin Glassworks, Weber has been able to put this unique praxis- based approach to good use. His interest in subverting traditional modes of production and research, now also incorporates a desire to explore new unconventional business models. Weber's first exhibition with Spazio Nobile was in 2017 as part of Season IV-Crystallized, with his experimental projects A Strange Symphony and From Below wich is currently exhibited at CID-Hornu, Belgium, within the exhibition At the Coalface, Design in a post-carbon age, until 8 January 2023. Quentin Vuong (FR) Designer

Quentin Vuong is a designer-scenographer whose aesthetic approach seeks to compose with matter, texture and form in order to create emotions. He uses pure, raw and even primitive forms, which he interprets and isolates thanks to a clever play on photographic composition and drawing. His sources of inspiration are ancient architecture, medieval fortifications or Venetian Gothic and the natural landscapes that surround them. From his experience acquired at the design department of La Fabrica in Treviso, he has retained the appeal of innovative scenographies dedicated to events marking the news of luxury brands, such as Veuve Clicquot during the Salone del Mobile in 2016. As of 2018, he puts his creative flair at the service of the production agency Back of the House. Together they conceive meticulous and radical design sets for Jil Sander, Oamc, Courrèges, Tom Brown and Acne studios. His experimental quest between noble materials and artisanal techniques is always at the center of his creations. Ouentin Vuong produces delicate objects and custommade furniture for his clients such as SĀR Studio, Please do not Enter, Ars Fabricandi or Haviland. Today, it is in his studio at Villa Belleville that he indulges himself the most by designing unique pieces, mirrors, armchairs or light reflectors. He infuses his design sensibility, his research on the expression of time in space through objects and his knowledge of materials. Quentin Vuong works and composes on a variety of projects, from scenography to fashion shows, fashion boutiques, furniture and gallery pieces. He is developing a new collection of mirrors in collaboration with Barbini Specchi Veneziani in Murano exclusively for Spazio Nobile. The gallery represents him since 2021.



Didi's artistic creations focus on craftsmanship and material culture. He aspires to broaden the concept of woodworking and contemporary design by emphasising the essence of wood in its materiality through conceptual thinking, experimental surface treatment, and carving techniques. His passion for woodworking throughout the years has aimed at exploring the honest expression of wood, which can be stated in one word - Naturalness. His work has been shown internationally, including a recent solo exhibition selected by the Talentshop at the Habitare fair in Helsinki Design Week, a group exhibition at Ukurant in the 3daysofdesign in Copenhagen, Alcova Project Space in Milan Design Week, and the curated section of Collectible Fair in Brussels in 2023. He

He has also carried out several study, assessment and consulting missions in Europe, Africa and the Mediterranean, with the goal of highlighting the importance of culture in the policies of the European Union, and its role in socio-economic development. Gian Giuseppe Simeone is author of several reference works on the study and recognition of the value of European and international culture and heritage. In 2016, he co-founded the Spazio Nobile gallery with Lise Coirier.
