Frederik Vercruyssse, Solo Show *Panoramic, 15 Years of Art Photography*

Curated by Spazio Nobile Gallery, Lise Coirier and Gian Giuseppe Simeone, *Panoramic* is a tribute to the enduring precision and quiet power of Vercruyssse's gaze, framed within a space marked for erasure, yet momentarily transformed into a site of reflection and vision. Staged in a modernist 1970s villa in Knokke Le Zoute—where Vlassak-Verhulst will soon build a unique project—the exhibition becomes a metaphor for transience and memory.

Panoramic is both a title and a state of mind—a mode of looking that extends beyond the immediate, capturing space, time, and atmosphere in a single, contemplative gesture. In this retrospective celebrating 15 years of art photography by Frederik Vercruyssse, *Panoramic* becomes a reflection on precise yet poetic sensibility, minimal yet layered, rooted in architectural order and soft and subtle light.

In contemporary art, the panoramic is not merely a format—it is a philosophy. It encompasses the totality of a moment, offering not only a wide-angle view but a sense of continuity and emotional resonance. Vercruyssse's work inhabits this space between design and reverie, structure and silence, distilling reality into visual compositions that echo the restrained beauty of natural and manmade environments.

Photography, in this context, is an act of framing what often escapes notice. Vercruyssse's lens captures more than buildings or interiors; it seizes atmospheres—coastal light, fading shadows, surfaces brushed by time. The nearby North Sea, just a short walk from the villa, permeates this visual language: flat horizons, grey-blue hues, wind-shaped lines, and a constant negotiation between permanence and change. The sea's

presence, though often off-frame, is felt as a vast, invisible actor shaping the mood and material memory of the images.

This private space becomes for a brief moment a vessel of memory and vision. The house itself, like many coastal structures, stands on the edge—between past and future, shelter and disappearance, preservation and transformation. In collaboration with Vlassak-Verhulst, Allaert Staal and Wever & Ducré/Wästberg, *Panoramic* evokes the horizon as a metaphor for artistic exploration and cultural identity, anchored in the Belgian affinity for craftsmanship, visual clarity, and the subtle interplay between manmade space and elemental force.

Frederik Vercruyse (BE) Photographer

Frederik Vercruyse is a celebrated Belgian photographer renowned for his minimalist, atmospheric visual style. Based in Antwerp, he has gained international recognition for his distinctive approach to still lifes, architecture, interiors and landscapes. His serene, meticulously composed images are noted for their clarity, balance and poetic restraint.

Vercruyse broadly defines his work as still life photography, whether he is capturing spaces, objects or natural environments. Regardless of the subject, his aim remains consistent: to reveal things in their purest, most essential form. His photographs are characterised by a refined visual order, muted colour palettes and thoughtful interplay of light and shadow. "I work in a really controlled way," he explains. "I weigh and balance until my image finds its equilibrium." This guiding principle informs both his personal and commercial work, blurring the boundaries between fine art and applied photography.

Although he was initially drawn to a career in architecture, Vercruyse soon realised that his true passion lay not in designing buildings, but

but in capturing their emotional and spatial essence through photography. For him, photography is a pure craft—an act of seeing rather than seeking. "You don't think of the most beautiful things," he says. "You have to dare to see them and be able to visualize them." His architectural sensibility runs deep, informing not only his choice of subject but also the structure, composition, and subtle modulation of light within his images. Photography becomes a way to translate atmosphere, silence, and tension into an immersive and deeply personal visual language. Photographing something he truly connects with gives him a profound sense of peace—offering a meditative state of mind where presence and perception merge.

His commercial portfolio includes collaborations with prestigious international clients such as Hermès, Delvaux, Molteni&C, Zara Home, Vincent Van Duysen, B&B Italia, Diptyque, Axel Vervoordt, Muller Van Severen, Raf Simons, and Tiffany & Co. His editorial work has been featured in publications including The New York Times, WSJ Magazine and Architectural Digest.

In 2016, Vercruyse published *Index 2006–2016* (Luster), a ten-year retrospective of his photographic journey through the worlds of architecture, design, fashion and art. He is represented by ILA in the Benelux region and by Quadriga Management in Paris and New York. Since 2017, Spazio Nobile Gallery has exhibited and represented his fine art photography. His personal projects often explore themes of silence, time, materiality and transformation. Created during a residency at Villa Lena in Tuscany, *Tempo Polveroso* captures the otherworldly stillness of the region's marble quarries. *Windows*, exhibited at Spazio Nobile in 2021, examined the relationship between architecture, reflection, and human presence through layered compositions and digital interventions. Other notable works, such as the *Atlantic Series* and his 2017 collaboration with Belgian ceramicist Piet Stockmans within the gallery's duo exhibition, *Blauw, Ceci n'est pas une couleur*, further revealed his enduring interest in texture, mood, and spatial abstraction.

Over the past decades, Frederik Vercruyse has developed a photographic vision grounded in architectural sensitivity and minimalist aesthetics. His work, which is both documentary and artistic, has earned him an esteemed place on the international stage, with a style that bridges the worlds of design, fashion, media, and fine art.

Frederik Vercruyssse, Exposition personnelle *Panoramic, 15 ans de photographie d'art*

Organisée par la galerie Spazio Nobile, sous la direction de Lise Coirier et Gian Giuseppe Simeone, *Panoramic* rend hommage à la précision et à la puissance tranquille du regard de Frederik Vercruyssse, dans un espace habituellement effacé, mais temporairement transformé en lieu de réflexion et de vision.

Présentée dans une villa moderniste des années 1970 à Knokke Le Zoute, où Vlassak-Verhulst réalisera bientôt un projet architectural unique, l'exposition devient une métaphore de l'éphémère et de la mémoire.

Panoramic est à la fois un titre et une attitude mentale : une façon de regarder qui dépasse l'instant, capturant l'espace, le temps et l'atmosphère en un seul geste contemplatif. Cette rétrospective, qui célèbre quinze ans de photographie artistique, incarne une sensibilité à la fois précise et poétique, minimalistre et stratifiée, enracinée dans une rigueur architecturale et une lumière douce, subtilement modulée.

Dans le champ de l'art contemporain, le panoramique n'est pas seulement un format, c'est une philosophie. Il embrasse la totalité d'un instant, offrant une vue d'ensemble enrichie d'un sentiment de continuité et d'une profondeur émotionnelle.

Le travail de Vercruyssse se situe dans cet entre-deux, entre design et rêverie, structure et silence, distillant le réel en compositions visuelles qui célèbrent la beauté discrète des environnements naturels et construits.

Dans ce contexte, la photographie devient un acte de mise en lumière de ce qui échappe souvent au regard. L'objectif de Vercruyssse ne capte pas seulement des bâtiments ou des intérieurs : il saisit des atmosphères – la lumière côtière, les ombres

fugaces, les surfaces patinées par le temps. La mer du Nord, à quelques pas de la villa, infuse son langage visuel : horizons plats, tons gris-bleutés, lignes sculptées par le vent, négociation permanente entre permanence et transformation. Souvent hors champ, la mer est pourtant omniprésente, agissant comme une force invisible qui façonne l'ambiance et la mémoire matérielle des images.

Cet espace privé devient, l'espace d'un instant, un réceptacle de mémoire et de vision. La maison elle-même, comme tant d'autres structures côtières, se tient à la frontière entre passé et avenir, refuge et disparition, préservation et transformation.

En collaboration avec Vlassak-Verhulst, Allaert Staal et Wever & Ducré / Wästberg, *Panoramic* évoque l'horizon comme métaphore de l'exploration artistique et de l'identité culturelle, ancrée dans l'affinité belge pour l'artisanat, la clarté visuelle, et l'interaction subtile entre espace construit et forces élémentaires.

Frederik Vercruyssse (BE)

Photographe

Frederik Vercruyssse est un photographe belge de renom, reconnu pour son style visuel à la fois minimaliste et atmosphérique. Basé à Anvers, il s'est forgé une réputation internationale grâce à son approche singulière de la nature morte, de l'architecture, des intérieurs et des paysages. Ses images, sereines et soigneusement construites, se distinguent par leur clarté, leur équilibre et leur retenue poétique.

Frederik Vercruyssse qualifie son travail, dans son ensemble, de photographie de nature morte : qu'il s'agisse d'espaces, d'objets ou d'environnements naturels, son objectif reste constant — révéler les choses dans leur forme la plus pure et essentielle. Ses compositions, guidées par une logique visuelle rigoureuse, privilégient des palettes sobres et un travail subtil sur l'ombre et la lumière. « Je travaille de manière très contrôlée », confie-t-il. « Je pèse et équilibre l'image jusqu'à ce qu'elle atteigne sa justesse. » Ce principe irrigue aussi bien son travail personnel que commercial, abolissant la frontière entre photographie tel un art appliqué et pratique artistique.

S'il a d'abord envisagé une carrière d'architecte, Frederik Vercruyssse découvre rapidement que sa véritable vocation réside dans la capture de

l'essence émotionnelle et spatiale des bâtiments plutôt que dans leur conception. Pour lui, la photographie est un art de la perception, un acte de voir plus que de chercher : « Vous ne pensez pas aux choses les plus belles », dit-il, « il faut oser les voir et savoir les visualiser. » Sa sensibilité architecturale, omniprésente, influence tant le choix de ses sujets que la structure, la composition et la modulation lumineuse de ses images. La photographie devient alors un langage immersif, à travers lequel il traduit atmosphère, silence et tension. Lorsqu'il photographie un sujet qui le touche profondément, il atteint un état de paix intérieure, presque méditatif, où présence et perception se confondent.

Son portfolio commercial rassemble des collaborations avec des clients prestigieux tels que Hermès, Delvaux, Molteni&C, Zara Home, Vincent Van Duysen, B&B Italia, Diptyque, Axel Vervoordt, Muller Van Severen, Raf Simons ou Tiffany & Co. Son travail éditorial est régulièrement publié dans The New York Times, WSJ Magazine ou Architectural Digest.

En 2016, il publie *Index 2006–2016* (éd. Luster), une rétrospective couvrant dix années de création au croisement de l'architecture, du design, de la mode et de l'art. Il est représenté par ILA pour le Benelux, et par Quadriga Management à Paris et New York.

Depuis 2017, ses photographies d'art sont exposées et représentées par la galerie Spazio Nobile. Ses projets personnels explorent les thèmes du temps, du silence, de la matérialité et de la transformation. Réalisée lors d'une résidence à la Villa Lena, en Toscane, la série *Tempo Polveroso* capture le calme surnaturel des carrières de marbre locales. En 2021, *Windows*, exposée chez Spazio Nobile, explore les liens entre architecture, reflets et présence humaine, à travers des compositions superposées et des interventions numériques. Parmi ses autres séries marquantes, on compte *Atlantic*, ainsi que sa collaboration avec le céramiste belge Piet Stockmans en 2017 dans le cadre de l'exposition duo *Blauw, Ceci n'est pas une couleur*, qui témoignent toutes d'un intérêt constant pour la texture, l'atmosphère et l'abstraction spatiale.

Au fil des décennies, Frederik Vercruyssse a façonné une vision photographique fondée sur une esthétique minimaliste et une sensibilité architecturale. À la croisée du documentaire et de l'artistique, son œuvre occupe aujourd'hui une place majeure sur la scène internationale, tissant un lien subtil entre les mondes du design, de la mode, des médias et des beaux-arts.

Frederik Vercruyssse, solotentoonstelling
Panoramic, 15 jaar kunsfotografie

Van 8 tot 31 augustus 2025 presenteert Spazio Nobile Gallery -gecureerd door Lise Coirier en Gian Giuseppe Simeone- de solotentoonstelling *Panoramic*, een retrospectieve van fotograaf Frederik Vercruyssse naar aanleiding van 15 jaar artistiek werk. De tentoonstelling vindt plaats in een modernistische villa uit de jaren '70 in Knokke Het Zoute, een locatie die binnenkort getransformeerd wordt door Vlassak-Verhulst. Voor even wordt deze plek echter omgevormd tot een ruimte voor reflectie en beeldende poëzie.

Panoramic is meer dan een titel – het is een manier van kijken. Een houding die verder reikt dan het directe en het vluchtige. In deze selectie van werk uit de afgelopen 15 jaar vangt Vercruyssse ruimte, tijd en sfeer in verstilde beelden die balanceren tussen precisie en gevoeligheid. Zijn minimalistische stijl is geworteld in een diepe affiliateit met architectuur, licht en materialiteit.

Waar het panorama in de fotografie vaak wordt geassocieerd met formaat, wordt het hier een filosofie. Vercruyssse's werk nodigt uit tot traag kijken en laat ons stilstaan bij de schoonheid van het alledaagse: het kustlicht, vervagende schaduwen, verweerde texturen. De nabijgelegen Noordzee, op slechts een korte wandeling van de villa, doordringt deze beeldtaal. Zelfs wanneer de zee buiten beeld blijft, is haar aanwezigheid voelbaar in de beelden – als een stille kracht die landschap en herinnering doordrenkt.

De villa waar *Panoramic* plaatsvindt, bevindt zich letterlijk en figuurlijk op een kantelpunt: tussen verleden en toekomst, tussen verdwijnen en opnieuw verschijnen. Net als de foto's van

Vercruyssse is het een ruimte waar stilte spreekt en waar details betekenis krijgen.

De tentoonstelling komt tot stand in samenwerking met Vlassak-Verhulst, Allaert Staal en Wever & Ducré/Wästberg, en weerspiegelt de Belgische traditie van vakmanschap, visuele helderheid en verfijnd design.

Frederik Vercruyssse (BE) Fotograaf

Frederik Vercruyssse is een gevied Belgische fotograaf – gevestigd in Antwerpen, die internationale erkenning geniet voor zijn minimalistische en poëtische stijl. Zijn werk bevindt zich op het raakvlak van stillevens, architectuur, interieur en landschap.»

Ongeacht het onderwerp blijft zijn benadering consistent: het streven naar zuiverheid en essentie in elk beeld. Of hij nu ruimtes, objecten of natuur vastlegt, Vercruyssse omschrijft zijn werk als stillevens fotografie in de brede zin van het woord. Zijn foto's worden gekenmerkt door een verfijnde visuele orde, zachte kleurpaletten en een doordachte interactie tussen licht en schaduw. "Ik werk op een heel gecontroleerde manier," zegt hij. "Ik weeg en balanceer totdat mijn beeld zijn evenwicht vindt." Deze werkwijze bepaalt zowel zijn persoonlijke als commerciële projecten, waarbij de grens tussen toegepaste en beeldende fotografie vervaagt.

Aanvankelijk overwoog Vercruyssse een carrière in de architectuur, maar hij ontdekte al snel dat zijn echte passie lag in het vastleggen van ruimtelijke en emotionele essentie. Voor hem is fotografie een

ambacht, een daad van zien in plaats van zoeken. "Je denkt niet aan de mooiste dingen," stelt hij. "Je moet ze durven zien en ze kunnen visualiseren." Deze architecturale gevoeligheid is diep verankerd in zijn werk, zichtbaar in zijn onderwerpkeuze, compositie en in zijn subtiel gebruik van licht.

Zijn commerciële portfolio omvat samenwerkingen met prestigieuze internationale klanten zoals Hermès, Delvaux, Molteni&C, Zara Home, Vincent Van Duysen, B&B Italia, Diptyque, Axel Vervoordt, Muller Van Severen, Raf Simons en Tiffany & Co. Daarnaast verscheen zijn werk in magazines zoals The New York Times, WSJ Magazine en Architectural Digest.

In 2016 publiceerde hij *Index 2006–2016* (bij Luster), een overzicht van zijn fotografische reis doorheen architectuur, design, mode en kunst. Hij wordt vertegenwoordigd door ILA (Benelux) en Quadriga Management (Parijs & New York).

Sinds 2017 exposeert en vertegenwoordigt Spazio Nobile Gallery zijn artistiek werk.

Zijn persoonlijke projecten verkennen vaak thema's als stilte, tijd, materialiteit en transformatie. *Tempo Polveroso*, gerealiseerd tijdens een residentie in Villa Lena (Toscane), legt de buitenaardse stilte van marmergroeven vast.

Windows, tentoongesteld bij Spazio Nobile in 2021, onderzoekt de relatie tussen architectuur, reflectie en menselijke aanwezigheid via gelaagde composities en digitale interventies.

Andere markante werken, zoals de *Atlantic Series* en zijn samenwerking met keramist Piet Stockmans in het kader van de duo-expo *Blauw, Ceci n'est pas une couleur* (2017), tonen zijn blijvende interesse in textuur, sfeer en ruimtelijke abstractie.

Doorheen de jaren ontwikkelde Vercruyssse een beeldtaal die geworteld is in architecturale gevoeligheid en minimalistische esthetiek. Zijn werk beweegt zich moeiteloos tussen documentair en artistiek, en heeft hem een gerespecteerde plaats opgeleverd binnen de internationale wereld van fotografie, design, mode en beeldende kunst.


